

To register for CIS, you must first visit the gov.uk website to register. It will then instruct you to visit your government gateway:

Register online

The quickest way to register is online.

To use the online service, you need a:

- UTR
- · Government Gateway user ID and password

If you do not have a UTR, <u>register as a new business for Self Assessment</u> and choose 'working as a subcontractor' when prompted. You'll be registered for Self Assessment and CIS at the same time.

If you do not have a Government Gateway user ID, you can create one when you use the service.

If you're an agent, use the Government Gateway user ID you use to sign in to your agent services account.

Start now

Once you have logged in, it will ask you to confirm some basic details, such as your name, email address and other contact details, and how you wish to wish the HMRC to share information with you. You will be registering for CIS 'Net' payment (20% deduction).



It will then ask you to check your details are correct:

Check your answers for your details

It will then ask you about the applicant (you) – you will need to confirm you are a sole trader, your name, address and if you have a different trading name or address for your business.

You will then need to let the HMRC know what kind of construction work you do – this can be either via the standard descriptions, or you can free type what you do if it isn't covered by any of the other descriptions.

You will then need to confirm the date you started working in construction and your UTR number. You will also need to confirm your NI number and whether you are registered for VAT (if applicable).

Once the application has been accepted, the HMRC will start processing it. The average time is 10-15 days, which can be longer or shorter.

Once your application is confirmed and registered, the HMRC will contact you by email or post (depending on how you've asked them to notify you) to confirm your registration.

Once you have received this notification that you are registered, you will need to let whoever is paying you know that you are now registered for CIS 20% deduction. They can then try to re-verify you on the HMRC website.
